

November News

"Where did you sleep last night?" That's the question our case managers ask families that come in to seek assistance. The case managers ask this question to get a clear picture of the family's immediate need. Many of us don't even think about whether we have a comfy bed and warm house in which to sleep every night so it can be hard to imagine what it could be like not to know where you and your family will be sleeping tonight, or for the nights to come. The stress of this immediate need compounded with the feelings of failure and vulnerability are very evident when families come to see us. Our mission? To end this, this stress, this feeling of failure, this being in a very vulnerable situation, for every family who comes to us for help. We are hearing about increased homelessness in Great Falls and Family Promise is committed to helping homeless children and their families find shelter and ultimately achieve long term stability.

How do we do this? It depends upon each family's situation. That is where professional case managers are critical to assessing each family's need and to developing an individual stability case plan for each family. Families choosing to abide by a case management plan receive assistance in the form of help with finding housing, shelter, food, job searches, and navigating all the social services available. Families that receive assistance from Family Promise are committed to improving their current situation and ultimately providing future stability for their children.

Currently we have two case managers on site for two hours every weekday. To serve more families, we want to hire a Family Advocate who can also provide some case management services but who would also run the Day Center and shelter operations. This is a full-time position for someone who is passionate about serving children and their families. UPDATE from the Board Board of Directors

Jordyn Rogers, president; Steve Van Gilder, vice president; Mary Lehman, treasurer; Katie (Batterbee) Pung, secretary; Judy Statham, director; Lisa Beavers, director; Darreck Hale, director; Tom Mora, director; and Rachel Arthur, director; spent over 10 hours last month developing our strategic plan. We want to share it with you in hopes that once you know our priorities, you will be willing to participate in the plan we have for ending childhood homelessness, one family at a time.

From this extensive process, we have decided to go forward with a static site shelter. A static site is a Family Promise emergency shelter program where the guests do not rotate weekly through host sites and congregations, but instead sleep at one location. Instead of rotating sites, the volunteers come to serve and host the families. We are actively looking for a church or a property to consider. While static site shelters are more expensive to operate, we think that this solution will provide more continuity for the families staying there.

Additionally, we want to expand the hours our Day Center located at Central Christian Church is open. At the Day Center we provide case management, agency navigation services, shower and laundry facilities, internet and computer access, and meals.

What can you do to help? Find a property owner or church willing to provide space for a static site shelter that meets current safety codes. Contribute funds to help pay for the facility. Continue to volunteer to serve families at the Day Center or at the static site shelter when it is up and running. Great Falls has been actively supporting Family Promise for over seven years because Family Promise provides a communitywide response for addressing childhood homelessness. We are confident that together we can continue to work together to help our neighbors who are facing homelessness.

We are excited to announce our first fundraiser for the ELCA Youth Gathering in Minneapolis November 19-30.

This fundraiser will help raise money for our youth that will be attending the ELCA Youth Gathering in Minneapolis in July, 2022! We have 13 youth that have signed up for this life changing event. However, we will need the help of our church family!

Marty Johnson, a longtime member of Bethel passed away in 2018. He was a large supporter of youth ministries and donated his entire Art collection to Bethel to help raise money for youth ministries.

We will have a Silent Art Auction, where bidders can post their bid on the bid sheet posted on the art. This art will be displayed in the hospitality room. You can bid in person or you can contact Patty Braget 868-7641 or Tami at the church to place your current bid. We will run this auction for 12 days. At the end of the auction, the highest bidder will be the winner. They will be notified by telephone.

There are nine pieces of art, ranging in sizes from 15" X 18" -30" X 42". The artwork is from a variety of artist like: Gary Holland, James Seward, Lane Kendrick, John Peterson, and Colt Schendel.


