#### Greetings Bethel!

Over the past several months, our gospel lessons have focused on disciple-ship. We have heard stories of Jesus guiding his followers into discipleship, and about how that discipleship can be both incredibly joyful and incredibly difficult. We also heard the disciples ask, just a few weeks ago, for Jesus to "increase their faith!". As we walk together as a church and as people of faith in the world, we often ask ourselves questions like this. How do I increase my faith? How do I develop and grow as a Christian? How do I know if I am headed in the right direction? Last Sunday as I gathered with our book study group at Bethel we ran into a similar question about the idea of

perception. How do we know when our perception is on or off? How do we know if we are perceiving things correctly? We wrestled with this question...wondering if one's perception could be wrong, or if it was simply just one's perception. Eventually we landed on the idea that perception is just a piece of the journey to understanding. We often start with assumptions, move to perceptions, continue with experiences, and eventually reach understanding. This journey is not always a straight line, sometimes we never get past our assumptions about other people or situations because they are too intimidating to approach or get closer too. Other times we get all the way to understanding and everything changes, and we must start completely over. In many ways this process is just like discipleship. Our lives of faith are journeys that will wax and wane. They will take us to moments where we have deep understanding and close relationship with God and one another, and they will take us to moments of disillusionment and feeling deeply distant from one another and from God. The challenge in it all is how to continue along the journey with perseverance, love, and a curious heart. The challenge is also how to allow ourselves to be transformed by this way of being and this Jesus story. How do we move past our assumptions? How do we accumulate the bravery to walk forward into the unknown, trusting that God will uphold us even in the moments where our perceptions and actions might come out skewed? The answer is varied, I'm sure, but one piece of that answer is that we do it together. We do it while listening to one another, and while being open to voice of the Holy Spirit in our lives and in our communities. This week we will welcome Gabe Brannon from the ELCA Churchwide Office. He will share with us some of the ways that our bold giving, support, and belief in world where all people are cared for and fed have helped to empower ministries that are making a difference in the world. I am sure he will share stories and anecdotes from these ministries, and tell us of some incredible moments where Christ's love has been shared. As we hear these stories and welcome Gabe to our community I hope that you are reminded that incredible things are possible when we work together. Incredible things are possible when are willing to be vulnerable and work together and trust that God will show up in the midst of our relationships. I give thanks for the many relationships that have been built in this place over the years. I give thanks

for the ways that we are still reaching out into our community, into our world, and into our hearts so that God might continue transforming us and our world for many years to come.





Use your finger to trace this circle path. When you finally reach the end you can begin again. Keep praying as you go on your way!!


