2021 FLBC ANNUAL MEETING OCTOBER 9, 2021

Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp had a very successful year, although they were not sure what it was going to look like going into this program year. And although it looked very different than in years past, they were still able to serve Montana youth and families and give people of all ages a safe and awesome place to bring Christ into their hearts.

The meeting started at 2:30 pm with a welcome from Sandy Drollman FLBC Board President and Margie Feidler, Camp Director.

A short President's Report from Sandy Drollman was giving, sharing her kudos and appreciation for the staff and FLBC Board for all their hardwork and tough decision making over the last two years. Her term on the Board is up this year and a thank you was given to Sandy, by Margie for all her dedication to the camp.

In the Treasurer's Report the following information was shared:

- 815 guests (retreats/events/EEstudents) served from September 2020 to May 2021
- 7 weeks of Summer Camp for youth, families, and groups.
- 544 on-site campers (Youth and Grand Camp)
- 178 Glacier Wilderness and Senior High Off-site Campers
- 192 Week-long Family Camp and Custom Week Campers
- 15 Day Camps in congregations with over 400 Day Campers
- 52 Summer volunteers representing 8 states
- 36 summer staff

Although income was down this year due to smaller numbers served for safety purposes, expenses were down as well. (If you would like to see the info brochure or balance sheet please email Tami at bethelgf@gmail.com).

High light from the Endowment Committee report for the year 2020, they financially helped children attend camp, provided new beds and mattresses and strategic planning. At the present time the Endowment Fund has a total of \$821,071.00 some of which I designated for campter ships and the remainder can be used for operations.

Campaign to officially run 2022-2024

Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp is excited to continue caring for this special piece of creation entrusted to us through our "Holy Ground" mini Capital Campaign. Officially beginning in 2022, we will focus on outdoor improvements that need attention in order to continue offering fun, faith-filled, and safe programs for all. These items include:

1.	Paying off the Hughes Bay land purchased in October of 2020	\$46,000
2.	Repairing the Swim dock and installing a lift chair	\$37,000
3.	Putting electric wires to upper bath house underground	\$20,000
4.	Removing diseased/dangerous trees and $\;$ planting new trees in the main area of camp	\$42,000
5.	Adding an entrance and new element to the High Ropes Course	\$35,000
6.	Installing a watering system and making needed improvements to the garden	\$10,000
7.	Adding additional storage, a new transformer and electricity to our Upper Parking Lot	\$45,000

In total, an estimated \$235,000 will allow us to make these updates, with the goal of raising these funds by 2024! As we look to 2023 and the 80th birthday of the ministry of Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp, we hope to ensure the land continues to be taken care of to prepare for the next 80 years of ministry at FLBC! God has provided this amazing land which has developed into a wonderful home for Christ-centered adventure programs for people of all ages, all year long.


