Greetings Bethel!

This weekend we celebrate Reformation Sunday! On Reformation Sunday we don our red clothes, sing "A Mighty Fortress" and other Martin Luther hymns and talk about how Luther nailed the 95 Theses to the door of the castle church in Wittenberg, Germany. As we enter into this weekend, I think it's important to talk about the "Whys" behind some of these things.

Why do we wear red?

The color red is the color of the Holy Spirit and the martyrs (those who have died for their faith) in the church. On Reformation Sunday we celebrate that

Martin Luther was moved by the Holy Spirit to reform the church, and that that work of the Holy Spirit was a Pentecost-type moment in which the Word (The Bible) was brought to far more people than just the clergy and church elite through Luther's German translation. We remember the martyrs who have worked tirelessly to continue to reform the church over the years on Reformation Sunday, and we also remember that we, too, are called to continue to reform the church and be made new through God's promises. Who knew that the color red represented all of that!

Why do we still celebrate Luther?

I have a feeling that if Luther knew we were celebrating him, or named an entire church body after him, he probably wouldn't be too terribly pleased. On Reformation Sunday, rather than celebrating Martin Luther, we celebrate the work of reforming that Luther and many others took part in. Obviously, we celebrate our heritage through Luther and his teachings, but even more we celebrate that through these teachings and reforms, we have had the privilege and the joy to come to know God, the Holy Scripture, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit more deeply.

Does this mean we don't like Catholics?

Absolutely not! We continue to hold many of the same beliefs (and some different ones) as the Roman Catholic Church. We have a different way in which we organize our Church and our clergy, but as Lutherans we have a rich history with the Roman Catholic Church that we celebrate and honor to this day. It is important to remember that Reformation Sunday is not an anti-Catholic moment for us as Lutherans, but a celebration of our history which influences how we live into our future.

How do we continue to be reformers today?

In the past few years the ELCA has repeated the saying "Always being made new" to many of our congregations and synods around the country. This emphasizes our commitment to not just be reformed once in 1517 as the church, but to always be open to God's transforming work in our midst. If we've learned anything in the past year or two, it is that the world changes and it changes quickly! Similarly the Church will change and grow and be made new. As God's people, we are called to be reformers by continuing to care for a changing world filled with changing people in new and diverse ways every day.

I hope this is a helpful framing of Reformation Sunday, and I cannot wait to worship with you all on Sunday!


